ROADS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2018

A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND THE ROADS ACT

Enacted by the Parliament of The Bahamas

1. Short title and commencement.

- (1) This Act, which amends the Roads Act (*Ch. 201*), may be cited as the Roads (Amendment) Bill, 2018.
- (2) This Act shall come into force on such date as the Minister may appoint by notice published in the Gazette.

2. Amendment of section 7 of the principal Act.

Subsection (2) of section 7 of the principal Act is amended by the deletion of the words “seventy-five” and the substitution of the words “ten thousand”.

3. Amendment of section 9 of the principal Act.

Section 9 of the principal Act is amended —

- (a) by the deletion of subsection (1) and the substitution as follows —
 - “(1) Any person who desires to make any excavation in or under any public road for any purpose, including the construction of any drain or water-course under such road or the provision of public utilities to any premises, shall make application as set out in Form I of the Schedule and submit the prescribed fee and upon the Minister's approval, the applicant shall be issued an excavation permit as set out in Form II of the Schedule upon payment of the permit fee specified therein.
- (1A) The person approved for conducting the excavation shall —
 - (a) at his own expense, fill in the same immediately after the completion of the work for which it was

required and for the restoration of the surface of the public road concerned to the satisfaction of the Minister;

(b) be responsible at all times until the final restoration of the road, for all necessary precautions to prevent injury, damage or loss to any person by reason of such excavation and shall be liable for any injury, damage or loss caused thereby.”; and

(b) in subsection (2), by the deletion of the words “seventy-five” and the substitution of the words “ten thousand”.

4. Amendment of section 11 of the principal Act.

Section 11 of the principal Act is amended —

(a) by the deletion of the words “twenty yards” and the substitution of the words “one hundred feet”; and

(b) by the deletion of the words “seventy-five” and the substitution of the words “ten thousand”.

5. Amendment of section 12 of the principal Act.

Subsection (1) of section 12 of the principal Act is amended —

(a) by the deletion of the words “seventy-five” and the substitution of the words “ten thousand”; and

(b) by the deletion of the word “fifteen” and the substitution of the words “five thousand”.

6. Insertion of Schedule into the principal Act.

The principal Act is amended by the insertion immediately after section 17, of the following new Schedule —

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Roads (Amendment) Bill, 2018, seeks to make additional provision in the Roads Act (*Ch. 201*) for —

- (a) an applicant to apply in writing to the Minister in the prescribed form under section 9 for approval to carry out excavation works in any highway;
- (b) for an applicant to pay an additional fee to be issued an excavation permit, once his above application has been approved by the Minister;
- (c) the insertion of a new Schedule immediately after section 17 in the principal Act to set out the form of the application to execute excavation works and upon approval thereof, the form of the permit to be issued to carry out such works, both of which are set out in Forms I and II of such Schedule.

Clause 1 of the Bill seeks to make provision for the short title and commencement. Clause 2 of the Bill seeks to amend section 7 of the principal Act in order to increase the penalty therein.

Clause 3 of the Bill seeks to amend section 9 of the principal Act to make provision for the procedural requirements set out at paragraphs (a) and (b) above.

Clause 4 of the Bill seeks to amend section 11 of the principal Act in order to increase the penalty therein.

Clause 5 of the Bill seeks to amend subsection (1) of section 12 of the principal Act in order to increase two monetary fines.

Clause 6 of the Bills seeks to amend the principal Act to achieve the object specified at paragraph (c) above.
