It is noteworthy to mention that four (4) deaths that were previously reported as non-COVID-19 deaths have now been reclassified to COVID-19 related deaths. Consequently, the death toll now stands as 209.

Further, three (3) deaths have been removed from deaths under investigation. Originally, these three (3) persons were suspected to be COVID-19 positive cases. However, on further investigation, these persons were not found to be COVID-19 positive.
